On the Theresienhöhe, overlooking the Oktoberfest grounds, the Deutsches Museum presents its unique collection of land vehicles: from racing cars to steam locomotives, from penny-farthings to ICE trains – here you can learn all about how people have travelled around the world through the ages. The three listed exhbition halls date from 1908 and are dedicated to urban transport, travel and mobility. Visitors can see the steam locomotive "Puffing Billy" and ride in a carriage along a bumpy road in the simulator. A highlight of the collection is the world's first gasoline car!


